The La Crosse Center parking ramps use a system that reads license plates. Therefore, those parking in any of the ramps between 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, need to register their vehicle's license plate number and pre-pay at one of the pay stations immediately after parking, or they will be subject to fines. Ramps offer hourly parking at the rate of \$1.00 per hour after the first three free hours of parking once per day (no re-parking allowed). Even though the first three hours are free, visitors must pre-register their vehicle at one of the pay stations to receive those three hours of free parking.

La Crosse Center Parking Ramp Instructions

- 1) After parking your car in the ramp, find a pay station. There is one located in each of the four corners on the first level, as well as one in the La Crosse Center skywalk.
Note: This must be done upon arrival, no matter how long you plan to be parked or you will most likely receive a ticket.
- 2) Enter required information by following the prompts:
 - Enter vehicle license plate number.
 - Enter estimated time you will be parking in the ramp -- it is better to overestimate.
 - Enter payment method.

In addition to the first three hours of parking on weekdays between 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. being free, parking on weekends is also free.

Handicapped Parking

Handicapped-accessible parking is available on each level of the Second Street and Jay Street parking ramps, as well as access to the skywalk on the third level. If you use the skywalk, you will need to exit the building and re-enter the La Crosse Center in the main lobby to have your tickets scanned.
